# Tuesday 15th October, 4th Realising Just Cities Open Conference, Cutlers' Hall

The conference dinner will take place in Cutlers' Hall at 1930. Pre-dinner drinks, a three-course meal and entertainment will be provided.

The plenary sessions and some conference sessions will be video recorded.

# Wednesday 16th October, Greater Manchester Fieldtrips and International Policy Exchange

On Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> October, Mistra Urban Futures delegates will be taken on coaches from Sheffield to Manchester for a day of workshops, field trips and a panel discussion. Please arrive at the departure point no later than 0730, where you will be checked in. Coaches will depart promptly at 0745. You should bring with you any refreshments you need for the journey and any outdoor clothing and footwear needed for your chosen field trip. We will not wait for latecomers. We expect to arrive in Manchester at about 09.30.

The departure point will be outside the **Leopold Hotel on Leopold Street**, **Sheffield S1 2GZ**. (See map below.)



<u>Important:</u> If you reserved a coach place when registering for the conference and no longer intend to travel by coach, please tell the SMLIP team in advance.

Please remember to bring your badge.

We will be dropped off at our primary venue for the day in **Chamber Space, Deansgate** in Central Manchester. Refreshments will be available on arrival. We will also be joined by some additional delegates in the morning who will make their own way to the venue. After a short welcome and orientation for the day, you will meet up with your fieldtrip guide and leave at 1015. Information about which fieldtrip you have selected will be provided when you collect your conference name badge—for a reminder see <u>here</u>.

Some field trips require a coach journey. Others will begin directly from Chamber Space. These logistics will be explained on the day.

You will return to Chamber Space for lunch at 1330–1430. We may be joined by additional Greater Manchester delegates at this point, who will also make their own way to the venue.

The afternoon workshop involves an International Policy Exchange with presentations from Greater Manchester decision-makers, an international panel discussion and a sharing and learning session. The workshop will be live-scribed by a visual minute taker.

At 1815 we will have pre-buffet drinks and a hot Italian buffet will follow at 1900. A pianist has been booked for entertainment. The Mayor of Greater Manchester has been invited to address us, but we will not have confirmation until much nearer the time.

The formal close and thanks for the conference organising will take place after 2000. Coaches will depart by 2100 at the latest to return to Sheffield.

The coaches will drop you back outside the Leopold Hotel at 2230.

# Thursday 17th October, Parallel Meetings and Lyla Mehta's Lecture

Most meetings will take place in the University ICOSS Building. The address is 219 Portobello, Sheffield, S1 4DP. It is a 12-minute walk from Sheffield City Centre.

\*Additional directions will be given to participants in this meeting. The Arts Tower is located uphill, to the west of ICOSS, off Western Bank.

The venue for Lyla Mehta's talk is situated inside **The Diamond** building, opposite ICOSS. Room 2.05 is in the centre of the building, on the second floor (lifts are available). <u>Important</u>: Access to the second floor is restricted. Please come to our registration desk in the entrance lobby (to the right of the ground floor reception desk) for help gaining access.

A buffet lunch will be provided in the ICOSS Foyer after this talk.

Meeting venues are available until 1700. At this point you must leave the building as health and safety requirements mean only trained staff are permitted to remain after 1700.

# Travel to/from airports

Allow 1 hour 45 minutes for travel between Manchester Airport and Sheffield train station. On weekdays and Saturdays there are 3 trains per hour. On Sundays there are two trains per hour. An anytime return ticket will cost £41.30. Cheaper tickets are available if you pre-book using <u>Trainline</u>. To arrive in time for the Welcome drinks on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup>, it is advisable to book a flight arriving into Manchester Airport no later than 1600.

# Car parking

Should you need it, Cutlers' Hall offers discounted car parking with a number of QPark carparks across the City:

- QPark Rockingham Street, Sheffield S1 4NL: £4 per 12 hours
- QPark Charles Street, Sheffield S1 2NA: £6 per 12 hours
- QPark Sheffield Station, Sheffield S1 4AA: £7 per 12 hours

To redeem the discount, please scan the ticket on your way out of the Cutlers' Hall at the machine located at reception. This will then take the car parking price down to the amount stated above. If unsure, please ask a member of staff and they will be happy to assist.

# Access

There are steps up to the main entrance of the Cutlers' Hall, but Commissionaires will be on hand throughout the event to place ramps on the steps if needed. Once in the venue there are accessible facilities on the ground floor, and lifts to the first and second floors.
